A little bit of History, -and a little bit of Truth.

This essay is **not** suitable-reading for American Presidents and their Generals. It **will** spoil their day.

A simplified background to the American and Australian invasion of Vietnam.

It was in the year 1887, that the **French** 'colonized' Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos, giving them the name '**Indochine Français**'.

The French ruled their colony in true, cruel, colonial fashion.

In the years between 1941 and 1945, -during World War Two, the Japanese occupied Vietnam.

With the defeat of the Japanese, the French returned,

and they returned to their old colonial ways of cruel domination, and exploitation but, -in Vietnam, something had changed.

A fifty-five-year-old man named **Ho Chi Minh** had something to say about it.

Ho Chi Minh did not like to see his country being raped by the French, so he led a revolution.

By 1954, he and his fellow revolutionaries had driven the French from their country, -but liberty and freedom was not to be, because

America had massive vested-interests in the exploitation of the Vietnamese people,

and the American Multi-Nationals said-"If the Vietnamese are allowed to get away with it, it will encourage the other exploited nations to do the same."

'<u>That'</u> was 'the real reason' behind America's unprovoked and unjustified invasion of defenceless Vietnam in November 1955.

Sadly, Ho Chi Minh did not survive to see the Americans driven from his country. He died on the 2nd September 1969, aged Seventy-Nine. When a nation declares war upon, and invades another nation, and when the fighting, the killing, and the dying, are all done, it is the nation that is still standing who is the victor, 'the winner'.

The one that runs away is 'the loser'.

On 25 June 1950, the then American President, Harry S. Truman,
